NWTF Technical Committee Representatives' Report - PA Chapter NWTF Board of Directors Meeting, October 4, 2009

#### **Harvest Management**

Preliminary spring 2009 turkey harvest was approximately 43,680 (41,400 first harvests and 2,280 second bird harvests). The ½ day youth harvest accounted for 6%, of the spring harvest

or 2,450 bearded birds. Final harvest results will be available next summer after completion of the annual Game-Take Survey. We sold 10,720 special turkey licenses this year. Beginning 2008 the spring season was extended to include Memorial Day. In 2009 this day accounted for 1-4% of the total harvests in each WMU, and 2% of the statewide harvest, accounting for a similar or larger harvest than the last Saturday in some WMUs.

Game-Take Survey data show 216,511 spring 2008 hunters, 6% below the previous 10-year average (229,894). However, these hunters experienced the best success (19%) since 2002. Hunter success exceeded the 2008 level only 3 other years (2000-2002). Final 2008 spring harvest, 40,480 ± 3,840 bearded birds, (not including harvests with the special turkey license) was 12% above spring 2007 (36,300), and 3% above the previous 10-year average, during which time we had record harvests of over 40,000 bearded birds from 2000-2004. The ½ day youth harvest accounted for 8%, of the spring harvest (not including special turkey license harvests) or 3,300 bearded birds. The total 2008 spring harvest (first harvests plus special turkey license harvests) was 42,440.

The final fall 2008 harvest was  $24,290 \pm 3,070$ , 4% lower than last year (25,370), and 30% below the previous 10-year average (34,810). Regardless, hunter success of 16% was the highest since 2002. Hunter success has been as high as 21% (2001, a year with excellent recruitment), and as low as 4% (1979). Numbers of fall turkey hunters (152,294) and days fall turkey hunting (486,592) continue to decline since the early 2000s.

In cooperation with the NWTF Regional Biologist, we are updating the white paper from 2003 that described spring turkey hunting options for the January PGC Commission meeting. Since then four additional hunting opportunities have been added: a statewide youth-only hunt the Saturday prior to the regular season opening (began 2004); special turkey license (began 2006), the purchase of which permits harvesting a second spring turkey; Mentored Youth Hunt, which includes spring turkey season (began 2006); and season length extended one day to Memorial Day (began 2008).

The Game Commission recently created a permit for possessing road-killed turkeys, similar to the permit for road-killed deer.

#### Wild Turkey Spring Harvest Rates and Annual Survival Rates Study

Our manuscript on loss rates of butt-end leg bands was published in the Journal of Wildlife Management (August 2009 - feature article and cover photo on journal), showing that loss rate of regular butt-end leg bands for gobblers is too large for adequate use in mark-recapture studies. Locking type rivet leg bands should be used for gobbler studies. The PCFWRC at Penn State is continuing data analysis and we are on schedule to provide a final report to NWTF by January, as well as submit the research findings to the Journal of Wildlife Management. Research results will be used in the regional turkey population model, our structured decision-making system for fall turkey season recommendations, as well as by other state wildlife agencies to assist with their turkey population management.

#### **Turkey Hen Harvest and Survival Rate Study**

Federal funding (Pittman-Robertson fund) has been approved for this four-year research study, to begin January 2010. We finalized the contract with the PCFWRC at Penn State (Dr. Diefenbach) for purchasing transmitters. Proposals from transmitter manufacturers are due to PSU this week for our review. NWTF research grant funding will not be available next year (2010) for new projects due to their temporary budget cut. We will submit a proposal the following year (2011) to augment our current funding.

#### **Turkey Summer Sighting Survey**

Data for the 2009 statewide WCO summer turkey sighting/brood index are being analyzed, to be used in conjunction with spring harvest data, to develop the 2010-2011 turkey hunting season recommendations. Preliminary results suggest the cool, wet spring weather negatively affected initial nesting and poult survival, but renesting did occur in many areas, so overall recruitment in 2009 may be only slightly below average. Hens appeared to enter the

spring 2009 breeding season in good condition due to average fall mast supply in many areas and a relatively mild winter.

#### WMU 5A Wild Turkey Task Force

This task force, formed in 1997, is comprised of staff from PGC, DCNR-BOF, NWTF, PANWTF and Local NWTF Chapters NWTF. The Task Forces meets annually to review progress of the existing turkey management recommendations for WMU 5A and determine what work is needed to increase this turkey population and how it can be accomplished through this cooperative task force. This year's meeting will be in October.

# **Northeast Upland Gamebird Technical Committee Meeting**

Mary Jo Casalena is the Pennsylvania representative for wild turkeys at this annual meeting, which also covers ruffed grouse, American woodcock, Northern bobwhite quail and ring necked pheasant. State/provincial upland gamebird biologists from all northeast states and Canadian provinces, and technical representatives from the National Wild Turkey Federation, attended the 3-day meeting, held in southern Virginia. The committee works on specific charges provided by the Northeast Wildlife Administers Association, cooperative projects and facilitates exchange of research and management information. The author of the regional turkey population model attended and worked through various simulations with me, providing me with a better understanding of the model variables.

# **Eastern Mast Survey**

A recent study in Virginia and West Virginia show that turkey harvest rates are lower during autumns with abundant mast crops because the abundance of food spreads the flocks making them more difficult for hunters to locate. Knowledge of annual variations in acorn crops is an important need of wildlife managers. In 2005, a regional mast study was begun. Since 2006 the PGC (with assistance from the NWTF Regional Biologist) has been participating with survey plots in three ecoregions. The Allegheny Plateau and Ridge and Valley plots yielded similar results: scare acorn crop from the white oak family, but above average crop for the red oak group. The Pocono Plateau plot yielded scarce acorn crops for both oak families. The PGC also conducts its own statewide mast survey and results are being analyzed by our black bear biologist.

#### 2008 Pennsylvania Turkey Hunter Survey

Completion of a final report has been delayed due to the lack of a biometrician. However, we are on schedule to present the results to the PGC Board in early 2010, and submit the findings as a peer-reviewed article for the Proceedings of the 2010 National Wild Turkey Symposium.

• Mary Jo reported a change in PGC policy: If you find a dead turkey you make take possession of it. You should notify the PGC and they will issue you a (free) permit.

Per the 15 Director's responses I received back, I tallied the Results as overwhelmingly Nay's to all four issues. Don created a short and to the point Letter to sent to the Legislature Leaders and I added my name to it, to make it official.

#### 4 points Reminder:

- 1)Marcellus Shale exploration and drilling expansion on up to 360,000 additional acres of DCNR State Forest land.
- 2)Remove \$175 million revenue on Oil and Gas Lease Tax revenue from DCNR that has been in place since mid 1950's and being placed in other categories in proposed State Budget.
- 3)Marcellus Shell Severance Tax legislation to be added into State Budget revenue stream.
- 4) New small games of chance 20% tax rate, revenue to be included in proposed State Budget.
